Woodland Walk

Welcome to John F. Leslie Wood. This walking trail will lead you through some beautiful and peaceful woodland. This part of the wood has many mature trees but don't forget to look down at the many wildflowers that are also found here.

Badger

The badger is a nocturnal mammal setting up home in an complex underground den, called a sett. They are social animals and the sett is often passed on from generation to generation. They are 'opportunistic' eaters whose diet includes a wide range of animals and plants. Earthworms are their most important food source followed by large insects.



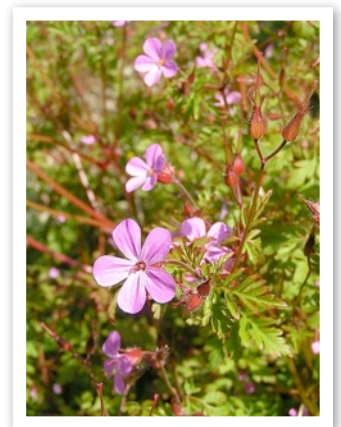
Bluebell

Bluebells are associated with old and ancient woodland and can be seen flowering in April and May. The flowers are lavender-blue, strongly scented and are pollinated by insects and bees. The flower stem is 10–30cm long and bends over at the top.



Herb Robert

This wild flower of the geranium family has small, pink, five-petalled flowers, about 1cm in diameter. Flowers can be seen from April until the autumn. The leaves are fern-like, and the stems are often reddish in colour. Herb Robert has a long history as a medicinal herb and was used to treat all sorts of ailments.
