Look around at some of the exceptional mature oaks in this part of the wood. The great tit is one of the very active birds that you're bound to see among its branches.

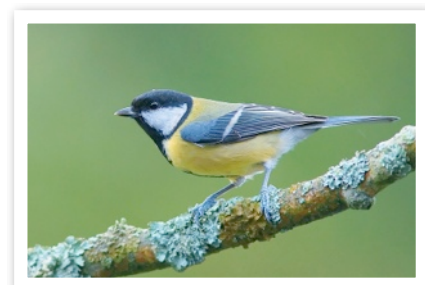
Oak

The sessile oak is the largest of the native trees of this woodland. Look for the deeply fissured bark, the broad limbs - often with mosses and ferns growing upon them - and the distinctive leaves with the many round lobes. The oak is our most valuable tree for wildlife as it provides a home for so many other species.



Great tit

This attractive bird is the largest of the tits. It is gracefully active and acrobatic and can often be seen hanging upside-down from twigs in search of caterpillars and other larvae upon which it feeds.
